## 7. UPDATES ON OTHER PLANNING MATTERS

## Old Power Station Development, Rugeley

A question was raised about whether there were plans to open a GP surgery on the housing development at the old power station site as infrastructure was already stretched in Rugeley and Lichfield.

Councillor Sutherland advised the Committee that the matter had been discussed but Cannock Chase Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) had concluded that a new facility was not needed. After consulting local GP's and surgeries the Clinical Commissioning Group had decided that it would rather invest in existing facilities. Councillor Sutherland said he would have supported a new facility, but existing surgeries believed they could accommodate new patients with investment. There will be 2000 to 2300 new homes on the site, whose residents will now be using surgeries in and around Rugeley.

Councillor Sutherland said that he would like the Clinical Commissioning Group to reconsider this decision. He believed that people needed to travel to centres of excellence, but more treatments should be administered locally.

Councillor Sutherland confirmed that there will be an all through school built on the site which was good news.

Councillor Sutherland reminded the Committee that it was necessary to ensure that walkways, pathways and cycleways are incorporated into the development in accordance with the original plans.

Cannock Chase Council and Lichfield District Council have been working in harmony and Rugeley Town Council was in the process of developing a Neighbourhood Plan which was good news.

The Committee acknowledged how quiet planning had been (in respect of new planning applications) over recent months.
